halom my friend! Last month I told you about a vital new resource I am working on, the Messianic Jewish Literal Translation (MJLT) of the New Covenant Scriptures (Matthew through Revelation). It is an especially exciting project, given that the founder of MJMI, Manny Brotman, held a deep desire "to see that every Jewish person in the

world has a copy of the Jewish Scriptures." It is my sincere hope that the complete MJLT will one day help to fulfill Manny's sweeping vision for the salvation of Israel.

I also mentioned last month my own desire to also write articles, essays, and perhaps even commentaries based on the

MILT version, to help people grasp the depth and truth of God's life-giving Word. Therefore, in support of the purposes of MJMI, I would like to share some of this teaching with you, beginning with the quintessential passages of Scripture that deal with

the special calling of Messianic Jewish believers, and their role as Israel in relationship to the larger Body of Messiah. Let us, then, begin our discussion of Romans 9, 10 and 11.

Paul's Lament for Israel

When Paul wrote his monumental treatise of the book of Romans, he was addressing the growing hostility between the Jewish and Gentile believers in Rome. In the first half of his letter, Paul covers a wide range of topics that affect all believers in Yeshua, not just Messianic Iews, and he does this to illustrate to both sides of the

divide how the truth of Mes-

siah applies equally to both, whether Jew or Gentile. By the time Paul reaches chapter nine, however, he is prepared to defend to the Gentile members of his audience the importance and uniqueness of the Jew—that is, of Israel. The opening verses express Paul's deep-seated feelings for the Jewish people.

"I say the truth in Messiah—I do not lie; my conscience bearing testimony with me in the רוח הקרש, Ruach HaQodesh—that I have both great grief and unceasing pain in my heart. For I was praying to be accursed—I myself—from the Messiah for the sake of my brothers, my relatives according to the flesh, who are ישראלים, Yis'raeliym [Israelites]—whose is the adoption of sons, and the glory, and the בְּרִיתוֹת, b'riytot [covenants], and the חורה, Torah-giving, and the עברה, 'avodah [(Temple) service], and the promises; also whose are the fathers; and of whom, according to the flesh, is the Messiah—who is over all, God blessed

> to the ages—אָמֵן, amen!" (Romans 9:1-5, MJLT)

Paul begins this section by lamenting the condition of the people of Israel, his unsaved

"brothers, [his] relatives

according to the flesh." As a fellow Jew, he deeply grieves and experiences "unceasing pain in [his] heart" on behalf of those whom, he implies, are "accursed" without Messiah—a position he would gladly exchange with them for the sake of their souls.

Through such testimony and prayer, Paul puts himself in the place of the unsaved Jewish people, fully grasping their lost

state, and crying out to the Messiah with a Messianic heart: like Yeshua Himself, he would willfully welcome his own death, if it meant life to his people.



The Special Place of Jews

But as Paul recovers from his lament, in verse 3, he begins to list the unique history and characteristics

of the Jewish people, as evidence of their worthiness

to receive special attention for the sake of salvation. He begins by saying that "the adoption of sons" belongs to Israel. This declares the Jewish people's special familial relationship to God through the Messiah, who is the Son. (Is "the adoption of sons" accredited only to the Jewish people? It all depends on the additional context of

Romans 8:15, 8:23, Galatians 4:5 and Ephesians 1:5!) Paul goes on to speak of "the glory" that belongs to Israel, presumably because of Israel's historic encounter with the glory of God (for example, see Exodus 16:7 and 24:16ff). Next come the בְּרִיחוֹת, b'riytot—the covenants—and the Torah, which were made and given explicitly and exclusively to the Jewish people (through whom the sojourning Gentile participates). Furthermore, Paul states that the עברה, 'avodah—the Temple ser-

vice—belongs, again, exclusively to Israel, since only the descendants of Levi are permitted to perform it. And, finally, Paul points to the result of all the other attributes: the promises, upon which the future and God-given purposes of Israel rest.

Paul concludes his list of Israel's special qualities with the anchoring concept that the Jewish people and the Messiah Himself both descend from the same physical lineage. Like Paul, Yeshua is a brother and a relative of the Jewish people—He is

one of their own, and as such, He looks out for His own family in a special and treasured way. Before all others, the Messiah of Israel will not forget nor forsake His own Jewish family.

Caring for Our Brothers

My friend, if this is the way Paul felt and cared about the Jewish people—His people—because of the Messiah, how much more should all believers in Yeshua—who are brothers and family members with the Jewish people through the Messiah—be burdened by, and seek the restoration of the salvation of all Israel?

This is the purpose of MJMI: to tirelessly proclaim the Good News of Yeshua to the Jewish people. We greatly need not only your prayers, but also your financial assis-

I recently received an update from our ministry friend Aviel, who has been sharing the Good News in the

> Land of Israel. He wrote: "Recently, I have been visiting a woman named Zinaida. Her life story is incredible. During the Second World War, she was 4 years old. She lived with her parents in Belarus, her dad was sent to the frontline, and the Germans entered her village and began killing the Jews. Her mom took her and her big sister and ran into the woods, and they lived there through the whole war. Zinaida told me that she always used to pray to God to ask Him to keep her and her family safe, and that many miracles had happened in her life.

"In 1998, she decided to move to Israel, where she got very sick and couldn't walk anymore. She prayed for God to surround her with good people, and since then, Christians have constantly visited her house. She told me that she had never received such love and caring.

> I told her why Christians love Jews and what the Good News is all about. She told me, 'Yeshua is certainly the Savior of all people, and I believe in it!' Then I offered for her to pray and receive Yeshua as her Savior, and she did it with a great joy. It is amazing how God is using all the Christians who have visited her and thus answering her prayers and preparing her for repentance."
